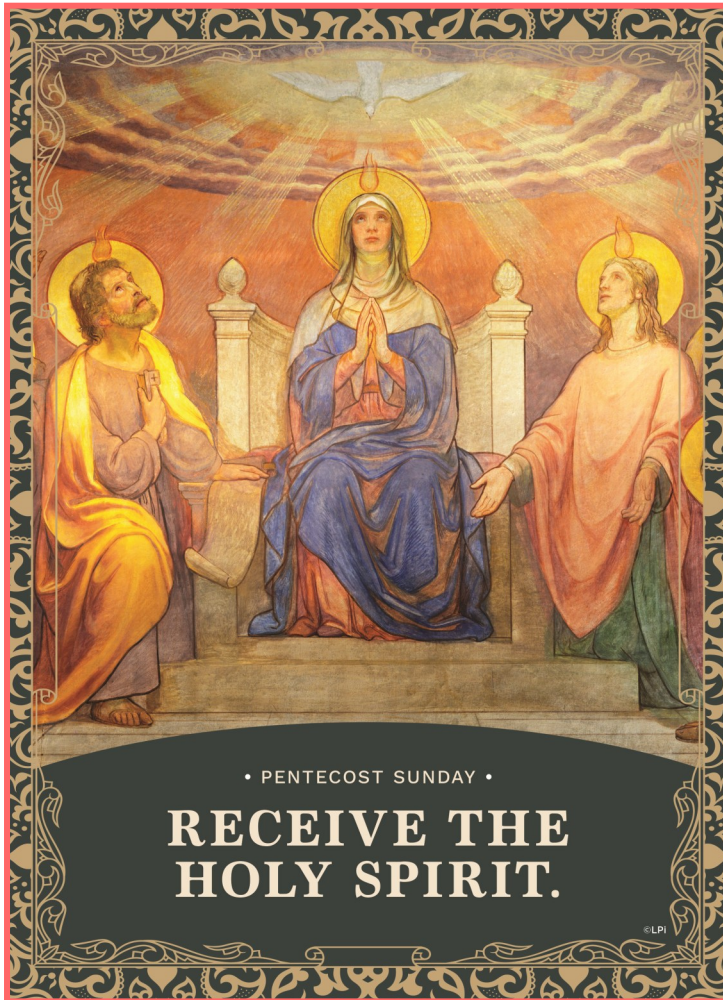

St. Francis de Sales Seminary, just south of Milwaukee, was founded in 1845 and built on its current site in 1855 because Bishop John Martin Henni was inspired to 'make this place holy.' Brick by brick, it was built by hundreds of workers, immigrants, seminarians and priest for the formation of priests for the faithful, for yesterday, today and tomorrow. Over 4,200 priests, including 45 bishops, 3 cardinals and 2 future saints, have been formed here for diocese throughout the country.



Something special is happening here. This building was last renovated in the 1980s to accommodate 35 men. This year there are 90 men in formation. They need more room. The building needs much attention, maintenance, restoration and expansion. We, as God's people, are called to help build this seminary for the

future. Archbishop Jerome ListECKi states, "It's not only for you, but it's for your children and for your grandchildren, and most of all for Christ and His Church."

We need holy priests, and the Seminary needs OUR help to prepare them to serve us and all of God's people. This weekend the parishes in our diocese launch the **Zeal for the Lord's House Campaign** to help raise funds for this \$75 million project.

Sign-up for the Parish Pilgrimage

It is time to sign-up for our Parish Cluster Spiritual Pilgrimage to two Marian Shrines in Wisconsin. Registration runs through July 1.

We will begin with Mass at Holy Trinity Church in Haugen on Tuesday, September 9 and then travel to St. Anthony's Spirituality Center in Marathon City and have time to explore the grounds and the 1919 seminary building before heading to Green Bay.

On Wednesday morning, September 10 we will visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Champion (the first and only approved Marian apparition in the United States). In the afternoon we will see St. Francis Xavier Cathedral before traveling to LaCrosse.

On Thursday, September 11, we will begin our day with Mass at the Shrine of the Lady of Guadalupe in LaCrosse and have time to walk around the shrine before heading back home.

This is a three day trip with one overnight stay in Green Bay and one in LaCrosse. Meals will be provided.

CATHOLIC QUESTIONS & ANSWERS?**Question:** Why do we celebrate Pentecost when we do?

Answer: The book of Acts unpacks the events immediately following Jesus' ascension into heaven. The Apostles and other disciples were told to pray in Jerusalem and await another outpouring of the Holy Spirit. As the weeks ticked on, the Jewish Festival of Weeks approached. This festival took place 50 days after Passover and celebrated the giving of the law on Mount Sinai. The Festival of Weeks (or "Pentecost" in Greek) was a great pilgrimage feast, with Jews from all over the ancient world convening on Jerusalem for the celebration.

It was on Pentecost that God chose to send the Holy Spirit. Here, the new law of love was etched into the hearts of the disciples. As he burst out onto the balcony above the multinational crowd, Peter proclaimed the message of the resurrection, and the Holy Spirit enabled every listener to hear in their native language. 3,000 people were baptized that day! The disciples — and every baptized person — receives the gifts and zeal necessary to bring a new message of salvation to the people of God. ©LPi

I am a sports fan, and perhaps you are one, too. I don't follow all sports, but those that I do follow usually involve a team. There is something about a team of individuals coming together for the goal of victory that is compelling. A team is only as good as the sum of all its players. If you have all the right talent at the right positions, great things can happen. What is hard for a fan to watch is a team that has great talent but fails to achieve its goals because some players choose not to give their all to the team. Selfishness, apathy, or immaturity keep some from giving fully of themselves. The hopes and dreams of a team and fan base are dashed even though they had all they needed to be the best.
